Closter's 9/11 Memorial Service: Patriot's Day, September 11th "we will never forget"

Completed in 2004, the Closter 9/11 Memorial is dedicated to honoring and remembering all of the Americans whose lives were so profoundly affected as well as paying homage to all those whose sacrifices have provided our cherished freedom. This memorial stands as a moment in time when at precisely 8:46 a.m., the moment the first plane hit the North Tower, shadows align and sunlight beams pass through a keyhole and illuminates an embedded piece of steel that was recovered from the World Trade Center, signifying the moment that all of our lives were forever changed.

Please join together as our community remembers *September 11th*. The 9/11 Memorial Service will be held on Tuesday, September 11th in Remembrance Park at the 9/11 Memorial located at the intersection of Cedar Lane and Harrington Avenue. The Closter 9/11 Memorial Service begins promptly at 8:30 a.m.

As such, the Mayor and Council has made provision for Vote-by-Mail ballots for the upcoming fall election. Closter Police Department

School is opening. To keep our pedestrians safe, the Closter Police Department is urging *everyone* to drive safely, STOP for pedestrians in marked crosswalks (it is a State Law), observe speed signs, and put down the cell phone while driving. These infractions all come with heavy penalties, ranging from points on a driver's license to fines and or community service.

Residents are being urged to assist in protecting their property. Keep cars parked in driveways locked. Key fobs, wallets, handbags and other items of value should not be left in vehicles.

Closter Food & Assistance Board

It's never too early to start gathering "treasures" to participate in the Town –Wide Yard Sale that is sponsored by the Food & Assistance Board. The 6th Annual Closter Town-Wide Yard Sale is ONE DAY ONLY on Saturday, October 13th. This is a rain or shine event. Closter's MacBain Farm Park

The MacBain Farm Park is a unique treasure established and supported by the Borough of Closter. Closter families may pick a small red bucket full of vegetables from the farm's 5.5 acres of lettuces, herbs, squashes, broccoli, zucchini, cabbages, eggplants, beans and tomatoes every Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The farm is staffed by volunteers, who host and mentor, as well as, try to maintain the far rows weed-free. It is a wonderful opportunity to teach children where their veggies come from, as well as the work necessary to make the produce grow. Bergen County Environmental Health

The County of Bergen's Environmental Health Department is seeking assistance in identifying the invasive long horned tick and other tick species found in New Jersey. PA Tick Surveillance Program has been started that will allow residents to submit a tick for identification. Please note tick identification results are not diagnostic of disease in humans or animals. If you think you may have contracted a tick-borne illness, seek medical attention.
