A patriotic concert sponsored by Closter's Recreation Commission

#### 2018 Summer Concert Series at Veterans Memorial Park

Summer is here and with it are the "sounds of music" filling the air from the bandstand at Veterans Memorial Park. The 2018 Summer Concert series opened last week with Tina & Tommy Walker's Shaved Ham Band. On Sunday, July 1<sup>st</sup> at 2:00 p.m., Joel Zelnik and Francine Evans will be performing their newest work, "This Is My Country".

Friday July 13<sup>th</sup> is an amazing night with "*The Willies*", Thursday, July 19<sup>th</sup> is the *New Beginnings Band*, July 27<sup>th</sup> is a featured performance by *Joe Delia and the Thieves*, followed on August 3<sup>rd</sup> with a performance by My *Anxiety Band*. Gather a group of your neighbors and enjoy an evening filled with music under the stars. Concerts will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the Closter Lions Band shell. All are welcome!

## **Closter Road Construction and Traffic Issues**

There are several road closures the Borough will be dealing with throughout the summer months due to road improvement projects. These include the Bergen County project to repair the culverts at Knickerbocker Road and Harrington Avenue, the PSE&G gas line replacement on Demarest Avenue and Closter Dock Road, and the Borough's resurfacing projects on Homans Avenue and Cedar Lane.

The Bergen County project at Knickerbocker Road and Harrington Avenue, which is already in progress, will have this intersection closed until November 1, 2018. The PSE&G project on Demarest Avenue and Closter Dock Road, also currently in progress, will have both Demarest Avenue from Durie Avenue to Closter Dock Road, and Closter Dock Road to Piermont Road, closed intermittently over the next two months to complete the PSE&G gas line work. The Borough's resurfacing project will require the closures of Homans Avenue, from Piermont Road to Anderson Avenue, and Cedar Lane from Knickerbocker Road to Poplar Street, sometime during the months of July and August. The exact dates are yet to be determined by the contractor. Although road closures pose an inconvenience, they are a necessity in order to maintain and improve the infrastructure of the community.

### **Closter's Borough Codes**

We are all proud of our community and work hard to keep our properties maintained. This creates attractive neighborhoods and generates a welcoming atmosphere within Closter. The Borough's codes were designed to maintain Closter's attractiveness as a community, but this requires everyone's assistance in upholding property standards.

Simple "housekeeping" will assist our community's appearance. For example, *Household trash* (i.e. table, chair, lamp, etc. up to 5 items) may be placed at the curb at 6:00 p.m. the night before the regularly scheduled  $2^{nd}$  garbage pickup of the week – not before. Call the DPW, 201-784-0753 to make arrangements for the pick-up of white goods before the item(s) are placed curbside. All televisions and computers must be recycled. The Borough requires that all properties shall be maintained free from plant growth in excess of 8 inches. *Garage Sales* require obtaining a permit which clarifies the permissible signage, number of sales a year and hours of operation and the *prompt* removal of signs. Some maintenance items, such as tree removal, driveway repairs, and fences require permits which are available from the Closter Building Department. Being cognizant of requirements and adhering to Closter's codes will aid in keeping Closter an attractive community.

### **Closter Police Department**

Summertime is vacation time for many folks. The Closter Police Department is reminding all residents to keep lights on timers, stop the accumulation of mail, packages, newspapers, etc. as well as lock vehicles left in driveways. Residents can always notify the Police Department when a house is going to be vacant. Overnight parking is prohibited between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Monday through Saturday and between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Sunday *on any street* in the Borough of Closter.

The Closter Police Department announced a Safe Exchange Zone for conducting in-person internet transactions. Residents wary of transactions via the internet with an unknown buyer or seller will now be able to do so in the parking lot of the Closter Police headquarters located at 295 Closter Dock Rd. There is a Safe Exchange Zone sign in the parking lot denoting the area under surveillance. The Closter Police will not have a hand in any transactions, act as witnesses or be involved in authentication of any item.

#### Closter Recreation: Summer Half-Day Camp at Veterans Memorial Park

The Closter half-day summer recreation program has been enjoyed by hundreds of youngsters. This program is open to Closter residents in Grades K-8<sup>th</sup>. There are arts and crafts, sports and weekly special events. The sprinkler pool is open daily, weather permitting. The Closter Half-Day Summer Recreation Program begins on Wednesday, June 27<sup>th</sup>, and runs to Friday, July 27<sup>th</sup> between 9:30 a.m. and noon at Veterans Memorial Field. #### **Closter's Annual Labor Day Festivities**

Summer is here and so are the plans for Closter's Labor Day weekend activities. Activities begin on Saturday, September 1<sup>st</sup> with the annual celebration at Veterans' Memorial Field on Monday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. From concerts, volley ball tournaments, a 5K Run, carnival rides and fireworks, the Labor Day weekend in Closter is an active time. A time schedule will appear in the July Newsletter.

#### Closter's MacBain Farm

Closter's MacBain Farm is a unique borough park that is operated as a farm under the guidance of the Closter Environmental Commission. The entrance to this 5.5 acre farm is on the north side of Hickory Lane, just below Anderson Avenue. The MacBain Farm is open Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for all visitors, but *only Closter residents* have the privilege of picking a bucket full of the myriad vegetables and herbs growing profusely and organically on the farm. One bucket per day per family is the limit.

To keep the farm in full production, controlling weeds, staking tomatoes, planting and seeding second round crops and to monitor the fields against illegal harvesting, the *Borough needs farm volunteers*. Enjoy the fresh air, beauty of the farm and teach children how food is grown while performing a community service. Children as well as adults are welcome, but those under age 14 have to be accompanied by an adult. There are a myriad of opportunities to volunteer at the farm, such as hosting, harvesting and field work. Volunteers who wish to act as farm hosts can sign up for specific times and on the days the farm is open to the public. #### **Closter Shade Tree Commission**

July is almost here, with long days and abundant sunshine. Trees planted last fall will need extra care the first year. Periodic watering during the first summer will insure that the tree flourishes for future generations. Newly planted/young trees require more frequent watering than older, well-established trees. For the first several months after planting, the root ball and surrounding soil should be kept evenly moist to encourage healthy root growth. After a few months, expand the watering zone to cover the entire area under the canopy.

It's vital to provide supplemental moisture in the early years, if nature doesn't provide regular soaking rains. During hot, dry weather, new trees may require water as often as three times per week to ensure that the root ball doesn't dry out.

## **Restaurant Grand-Opening**
