# **Affordable Housing Update – Borough of Closter**

The Borough of Closter's affordable housing settlement was approved at a Fairness Hearing held before Judge Toskos on July 24<sup>th</sup>. The next step is for the Borough's Planning Board to adopt a new Housing Element and Fair Share Plan. The Planning Board has held several informal hearings attended by many members of the public and will begin its final public hearing on November 1. Then, the Governing Body will adopt the necessary ordinances to complete the process. Finally, Closter's approval of the Settlement Agreement and upcoming plan and ordinance adoption will protect the Borough from potential litigation by developers, known as "Builders' Remedy Lawsuits" until 2025. The Borough is looking forward to completing the affordable housing process. The affordable housing Settlement Agreement is available on the Borough's website, www.closternj.us.

#### **Please Use Caution: DEER on our Roadways**

The NJ DEP is urging drivers to be cautious on our roadways as deer mating season begins along with daylight savings time. White-tailed deer become more active during mating season, also known as the fall rut. During this time of year deer are more apt to suddenly run onto roadways as bucks pursue does, creating the increased risk of collisions. Being cautious will become even more important when daylight saving time ends at 2 a.m. on Sunday, November 4<sup>th</sup> causing commuters to align with the periods when deer are most active and lighting conditions may be most difficult for driving.

#### Tips for drivers:

• If traveling after dark, use high beams when there is no oncoming traffic or vehicles ahead.

- Remember: The driver in front of you might have to stop suddenly; don't tailgate.
- Report any deer-vehicle collision to a local law enforcement agency immediately
