Office of Emergency Management – Residents with Special Needs

Closter's *Office of Emergency Management* (OEM) is working to identify Closter residents, who because of special medical or physical needs may require additional assistance from Emergency Management personnel during severe storms, power outages or natural disasters.

Resident's medical or special needs may include, but are not limited to, life support equipment or other medical equipment. Residents will need to provide their name, address, telephone number, type of medical or physical need as well as an alternative telephone number and emergency contact. All information is strictly confidential and will be kept in OEM's files to be used in emergency situations only.
