#### Closter Plaza's Newest Addition! <u>Lululemon</u>

Hold the date for the newest ribbon cutting at the Closter Plaza! Lululemon will be opening its doors shortly. This upscale, designer features the latest in yoga and running attire for both women and men. Lululemon is located in the middle of the Plaza, near Gary's Wines. Details of the ribbon cutting will be included in the February newsletter. We expect to cut the ribbon around March 1<sup>st</sup> followed by a celebration.

### **Closter's Volunteer Emergency Services:**

The Borough of Closter was founded on the premise that together volunteers can make a significant difference to the quality of services in the community, and, indeed, they have. Since its establishment in 1893 the **Knickerbocker Hook & Ladder Company** is staffed solely by volunteers who donate their time, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, responding to 285 calls last year. Complementing the emergency fire services is the medical emergency response and rescue operations provided by the men and women of the **Closter Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Corps**. The Closter Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Corps, Inc. is the only department in Bergen County, and one of the few in the state that provides both ambulance service and heavy rescue, inclusive of cliff rescues and rappelling.

To maintain the high level of services that these two organizations provide, Closter's emergency service organizations regularly recruit new members. The Closter Planning Board's Master Plan Subcommittee is hosting an open discussion on the reexamination of the Borough's Master Plan. This discussion will take place on Monday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, in the Tenakill Middle School's auditorium, beginning at 7:30 pm and concluding at 10:30 p.m. All Closter residents and business owners are invited to attend.

A re-examination of the Master Plan is mandated every ten years. This plan will review many items of interest to Closter residents such as: 1) More Sidewalks in town, 2) More Recreation Areas and Parks, 3) Should we build more larger homes or smaller homes, 4) Should we encourage more businesses or fewer, and 5) Do you have any ideas for improving Closter?
