BOROUGH OF CLOSTER ORDINANCE NO.: 2016:1215 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CODE CHAPTER 173, ARTICLE XVII. SIGNS

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that a change is required to Chapter 173, Article XVII. Signs, specifically, § 173-86, Inspections; and

WHEREAS, the Construction Code official and other Borough officials have raised concerns that certain signs, particularly A-Frame signs and sidewalk signs, may have lapsed bonds and/or liability insurance; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amends the inspection provisions of the sign ordinance to include a review of both and expressly states that failure to have same shall be grounds for revocation of a sign permit; and

WHEREAS, the Construction Code Official and the Ordinance and Legislative Committee have reviewed the proposed Code change recommend adoption of same; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that it is in the best interest of the health, welfare and safety of the residents of the Borough to adopt this amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. § 173-86. Inspections.

Delete the current text and replace same with the following:

Every sign shall be subject, at any time, to the inspection and approval of the Zoning Officer, Code Enforcement Officer or the Construction Official. The inspection shall include a review of bonds and/or liability insurance for the sign(s). Failure to comply with Section 173-87 (below) shall be grounds for revocation of a sign permit and the issuance of a notice of violation. The violation may be cured by submitting proof of compliance with 173-87 within 10 days of the Date of the Notice of Violation. Proof must be provided to and acceptable to the Borough's Building Department and Risk Manager.

Section 2.

If any sentence, section, clause or other portion of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, for any reason, be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or repeal the remainder of this Ordinance. All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

BOROUGH OF CLOSTER ORDINANCE NO.: 2016:1216

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER A301 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF CLOSTER REGARDING FEES AND DEPOSITS, SPECIFICALLY FOR THE LAND USE – RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT FEES

WHEREAS, the Borough of Closter desires to amend Chapter A301 of the Code, specifically to amend the subsection for residential development fees; and

WHEREAS, this amendment expressly removes the exemption for improvements and expansions for existing residential structures; and

WHEREAS, it was determined that similarly situated Bergen County municipalities do not allow this exemption; and

WHEREAS, the proposed changes were reviewed by the Assessor and the Ordinance and Legislative Committee which recommends that this amendment be adopted by the Governing Body; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Attorney has reviewed the changes and found same to be in order.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. § A301-1 Section E, Land Use fees, shall be amended as follows:

- A. Delete (8) (c)
- B. Add section 6 (c):
 - (6) (c) Development fees shall be imposed and collected when an existing structure undergoes a change to a more intense use, is demolished or replaced, or is expanded, if the expansion is not otherwise exempt from the development fee requirement. The development fee shall be calculated on the increase in the equalized assessed value of the improved structure.

Section 2.

A copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded by the Borough Clerk to the Construction Code Official, Assessor and Land Use Clerks.

If any sentence, section, clause or other portion of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, for any reason, be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or repeal the remainder of this Ordinance. All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE 2016:1202 AND AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 183 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF CLOSTER, SPECIFICALLY, SECTION 183-45

The Chief of Police, with the advice and consent of the Mayor and Counsel, shall determine the parking spaces which shall be so designated. It shall be illegal for persons who are not Borough Employees or who are not visiting on Borough Business to park in these designated spaces during aforementioned days and times.

Section 2

The Governing Body of the Borough of Closter held a Work Session on Monday, November 21, 2016. Council President Amitai called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

4. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF COMMUNICATION ITEMS

a. <u>MAIL LIST OF NOVEMBER 10, 2016</u> – Council President Amitai asked if any member of the Council wished to address any matter or provide any comments. Item Nos. 2, 3a.I.c. and 4 were removed by Council President Amitai; Item No. 5 was removed by Councilwoman Latner.

Refers to Mayor and Council approval required for installation of two "No loading/unloading" curbside signs on the Property!

Council President Amitai wanted all to be aware of this item.

<u>Item No. 3a.I.c.</u>: Received 11/04/16, Dated 11/04/16 from Michael J. Darcy, CAE, Executive Director, NJS League of Municipalities re Weekly Round-Up: Weekly Update re: I. Policy Issues: Legislation and Regulations; c. State Granted Amicus in Affordable Housing "Gap" Case Before State Supreme Court

In answer to Council President Amitai, Borough Attorney explained the COAH Gap period was from 1999 to now. Originally the courts ruled the municipalities did not have to come up with additional units to cover that gap period. Fair Housing has appealed the decision and now says those years should be counted. The State is asking to join in the case filing a brief on that issue supporting the municipalities position although they are not a party to it.

<u>Item No. 4</u>: Received 11/09/16, Dated 11/07/16 from Michelle Moon, Director of CGI Fitness Club, 111 Homans Avenue re Letter welcoming Closter Plaza Mall and requesting that concerns re trash blowing onto the property and noise from Whole Foods building be addressed with attached photographs (Copy to Property Maintenance Official)

Council President Amitai explained there are some code enforcement issues and informed that Jim Whitney has been in touch with them. In answer to Mrs. Amitai, Borough Engineer said the noise could be from the trash compactor but they need to find the source.

<u>Item No. 5a</u>: Received 11/10/16, Dated 11/10/16 from Lorraine L. McMackin, RMC/CMC, Borough Clerk/Administrator, Borough of Norwood, to Municipal Clerks re Certified copies of the following Resolutions adopted 11/9/16: a. Resolution Condemning All Efforts to Delegitimize the State of Israel and the Global Movement to Boycott, Divest From and Sanction the People of Israel

Councilwoman Latner explained this pertains to municipal resolutions opposing the delegitimizing of Israel noting she supported same. Council President Amitai asked Mrs. Latner to bring up same in the Regular Meeting.

b. <u>MAIL LIST OF NOVEMBER 17, 2016</u> – Council President Amitai asked if any member of the Council wished to address any matter or provide any comments. Item No. 3 was removed by Councilwoman Chung; Item No. 5 was removed by Council President Amitai.

<u>Item No. 3</u>: Received 11/14/16, Dated 11/14/16 from Neil L. Winter, Jr., Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. re O&R Joins Dozens of U.S. Energy Companies Warning: Beware of Scammers (Copy to Chief Kaine)

In response to Councilwoman Chung, Chief Kaine informed there have not been any of these types of incidents in Closter but said they have posted the information on all of their social media sites.

<u>Item No. 5</u>: Received 11/15/16, Dated 11/15/16 from Beth Ravit, PhD, Co-Director, Center for Urban Environmental Sustainability (CUES), Department of Environmental & Biological Sciences, Rutgers University re Request for approval to conduct a public meeting in the evening to hold approximately 100 participants during the week of 1/9/17 to discuss development of a Master Plan for the Bergen County Parks System (Copy to Risk Management Consultant, Bill Brewster)

Council President Amitai recognized Dr. Beth Ravit, former Environmental Commission Chair, in the audience and asked her to speak regarding her request.

Beth Ravit, PhD, on behalf of Rutgers Center for Urban Environmental Sustainability (CUES), informed they have been engaged by the County to make a Master Plan for the County's parks; and they will be doing extensive outreach to obtain public input. They are requesting the use of a venue in Closter because it is central to surrounding neighbors and there are parcels close by included in the study: two parcels in Alpine, East Hill in Norwood and the Rockleigh Golf Course. There will be two meeting phases: the first for public input; and the second to present draft ideas and get feedback.

Councilwoman Chung suggested if the Senior Center was not available that possibly they could use the Library. Borough Attorney informed the Senior Center may be too tight for 100 people and said the Library would be even tighter. He suggested coordinating possible dates with the Borough Clerk to see if there was availability for same.

Councilman Barad entered the meeting at 7:53 p.m.

Steve Isaacson, Environmental Commission Member, reminded that Dr. Ravit was Chair for many years; and although she moved out of town, she is still connected and on the Board of the Nature Center. He asked her to consider getting the Environmental Commission involved. Mr. Isaacson suggested that perhaps the auditorium at Tenakill School would be a good location; and Borough Attorney said they would need to request that from the Board of Education.

Councilman Stabile entered the meeting at 8:02 p.m.

5. <u>REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS FROM REGULAR MEETING</u> (Refer to the Regular Meeting Agenda of Monday, November 21, 2016)

Council President asked if any member of the Council wished to discuss any Item on the Consent Agenda. Councilman Stabile removed Item No. 13 for discussion.

13. RESOLUTION AWARDING PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT FROM PROFESSIONAL TECHNOLOGY SERVICES INC. (BOROUGH ORDINANCE 2016:11214, CAPITAL ACCOUNT C-04-16-214-026-006) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,969.00 (Received from Administrator's Office 11/17/16) Exhibit A

Councilman Stabile questioned the need for the table ("Work table with Bench Grinder Stand") and Superintendent of Public Works advised that same is a welding table.

6. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. FINANCE AND TECHNOLOGY - STABILE (BARAD/DI DIO)

- 1) REPORT RE CLOSTER WEBSITE
- 2) REPORT Councilman Stabile reported the Finance and Technology Committee was not able to meet due to the League of Municipalities Conference. He noted there are several Resolutions on the Agenda this evening utilizing Capital; and he is happy to see it is being used for those purposes. Mr. Stabile said the Finance Committee has received several Departmental operating budget requests which they will discuss after the holidays. Borough Administrator affirmed same and explained he would refrain from comment at this time on same because he hasn't been able to review them.

B. <u>PUBLIC SAFETY - LATNER (DI DIO/CHUNG)</u>

1) REPORT – Councilwoman Latner reported the Library got their new "Welcome" sign which has been a long time in the works and circulated a picture for all to see. She noted Donald Farrell sent the Library's budget and wanted to remind the Council about the final installment. She said the Library will be looking into Grants and State Aid for additional funding.

Mrs. Latner thanked Councilwoman Chung for arranging the County Clerk's Satellite Office. Mrs. Chung reported Mr. Hogan said they processed 100 passports and had a lot of notaries saying it was one of the most successful satellite offices so far.

Councilwoman Latner reported the Northern Valley Coalition Trunk-or-Treat was a success despite being moved indoors due to the weather. The Regional High School Board approved 25 new courses last year and added 14 recommendations for this year. She said a lot of the programs are theater related arts and she is pleased to see they are ahead of the curve and offering more career options. Mrs. Latner reminded they have teamed up with Bergen Community College and Seton Hall University to offer accreditation for some classes towards college credits. In terms of the Referendum passed, there are some punch list items but Phase I projects are complete, on time and under budget although the STEM rooms still need a lot of work. They will be putting out bids for Phase II shortly. Mrs. Latner informed that regarding the local schools, 10 minutes have been removed from the lunch period each day and an additional full day was added at the end of the calendar year. She said she was not aware if Councilman Di Dio was able to attend that meeting.

Mrs. Latner had some information from the League Conference she would present under New Business.

6. COMMITTEE REPORTS (Continued)

C. PUBLIC WORKS - CHUNG (LATNER/STABILE)

1) REPORT – Councilwoman Chung reported the leaves are falling rapidly and the DPW has been struggling with equipment malfunctions. Some of the leaf equipment was not working and a few garbage trucks were down, but most residents were not even affected by it despite these hiccups. She reported DPW Superintendent Bill Dahle had winterized the parks and the Lustron House. Mrs. Chung noted the new mechanic is still on a probationary period until the end of the year. She requested a Resolution switching him from probationary employee effective January 1, 2017. Additionally, she requested the Borough Attorney provide a Teamsters negotiations update in Closed Session.

In response to Council President Amitai, Mr. Dahle informed leaf collection would continue until the last of the leaves have fallen.

D. ORDINANCES - BARAD (CHUNG/AMITAI)

- 1) REPORT RE ORDINANCE COMMITTEE MEETINGS
- 2) REPORT Councilman Barad informed he had no report from the Ordinance Committee as it is late in the year and they cannot act on anything at this time.

Dr. Barad reported the Shade Tree Commission has two vacancies at this time; one due to health issues and the other being an unfilled vacancy. He noted former Councilman Kashwick has been an alternate on the Board and they would like to move him to full Member to fill one of the vacancies. He asked Councilman Stabile to consider taking his previous spot on the Board as the Alternate which would require less commitment from him. Councilman Stabile thanked Dr. Barad for the invitation and said he would let him know next week.

E. HUMAN RESOURCES - DI DIO (CHUNG/LATNER)

- 1) REPORT RE PERSONNEL COMMITTEE MEETINGS Councilman Di Dio informed this is his first report since the new Borough Administrator joined us and he welcomed Mr. Dolson on behalf of the Human Resources Committee.
- 2) REPORT Mr. Di Dio noted Councilwoman Latner previously mentioned the change at the local schools and said initially some parents were concerned but it seems to be working out okay. Mrs. Latner explained that there used to be 30 minutes of eating and 30 minutes of play; and now there is 30 for play and 20 for eating. Councilwoman Chung voiced her concerns that parents are not happy about the change because it takes away a significant amount of time for younger children in particular. She noted her own Kindergarten age son has difficulty situating himself for a meal and putting his things away; so a child his age would be affected, but what can they do about the change they have to move on.

F. LAND USE AND CONSTRUCTION - AMITAI (BARAD/STABILE)

REPORT – Council President Amitai reported the Improvement Commission may need to increase their budget in 2017 due to the anticipated purchase of new wreaths and bows for downtown. Councilman Stabile asked that it be included as part of their operating budget request. Mrs. Amitai said the Commission discussed the next Hoe Down and the holiday song fest will be held this year on December 6^{th} at 7 p.m. They discussed the possibility of having a food and film festival in the future.

Mrs. Amitai reported the COAH Ad Hoc Committee will be meeting Monday, 11/28/16. The Planning Board is not holding a regular meeting at the end of this month due to the holidays. She referred to the Mail List item from the Board (2. Mail List 11/10/16) and noted Multi-Phase Electrical will be approaching the Mayor and Council for permission to install signs. Regarding the Building Department, Chipotle opened over the weekend and she voiced her opinion it is nice to see the Plaza active again. Mrs. Amitai noted there have been some glitches with the Plaza but said they are being addressed as Edens is very responsive. She explained there have been a lot of fender benders in the parking lot because the spaces are on the shy side. The Building Department received application materials from Chase Bank which will be reviewed at the Planning Board Work Session the first week of December. Councilwoman Amitai said there have been some code enforcement issues and they have been discussing same with the Chamber of Commerce regarding enforcement.

6. COMMITTEE REPORTS (Continued)

F. LAND USE AND CONSTRUCTION - AMITAI (BARAD/STABILE)

Mrs. Amitai referred to previous discussions of excess lamp posts held by Coviello Electric and asked if that has gotten anywhere. Councilman Stabile reported he had spoken to the project manager; and it was not well received when he brought up the possibility of donating the lamp posts to the Borough. He was told it would be relayed to the boss but he has not heard back as of late.

7. OLD BUSINESS

Regarding the Hickory Lane Speed Table, Borough Engineer advised that the quote for the table a. was received from DLS Contracting, the 2015 Road Program contractor, in the amount of \$24,925.00. The contractor said he could start next week but if we wait until the next meeting for approval of same, he would not recommend doing the job this year. He noted that the specifications were the same as discussed. In answer to Councilman Stabile, Borough Engineer said that an asphalt speed table would be approximately \$5,000 less if part of a paving program but not much more otherwise. Councilwoman Chung expressed concern about explaining the installation of the speed table on this particular street to residents of other streets who also want a speed table. Councilwoman Latner noted the opening of Metropolitan Plant, which was very disruptive to the neighbors; and Council President Amitai explained the history of the street from narrow and winding to a wider and faster street in addition to now having truck traffic delivering merchandise to a store in the middle of a residential area. Borough Engineer advised that the street is not wider according to the plans. Council President Amitai said if someone wants to approach the residents about participating in the cost of the Belgium block and Councilwoman Chung also expressed concern about the excess noise that may be created with the installation of the speed table. Councilman Barad noted that we understand the disappointment of the residents relative to the farm but the speed table has to do with traffic, speed and safety. In general, we do not wish to put in speed tables because of the risks associated with same, but we have to proceed based on the advice of the professionals.

Police Chief Kaine noted that the speed tubes put in by the Borough Engineer in addition to the radar indicated that there was not a lot of speeding. Councilman Barad noted we should not be in a hurry to install the speed table because based on the information we have, it is not an emergent matter. Council President Amitai noted that the street is relatively narrow, the sidewalks are not standard and there is little or no safe area to walk on Hickory Lane; and she suggested that the Council members walk the street. Councilman Barad urged further investigation of safety concerns before a decision is made. Councilman Stabile said the installation was removed from the bid package at the time; and in answer to a question about Vervalen Street, Borough Engineer said that the bid was rejected and would be rebid in January or February for work to be accomplished in the Spring. Borough Engineer said he needs an answer for the contractor on the speed table; and Chief Kaine informed the speed tubes indicated that 85% of the drivers were traveling below 29 m.p.h. Councilman Stabile said that he does not feel the objective data is there to spend \$25,000 for a speed table.

b. Referring to the Borough Parking Lot Signs, Council President Amitai reminded that former Chief Brewster (Senior Citizens President) had said that some of the money from the State grant for building the Senior Center was for senior parking; the signage was not what was agreed to at the meeting with the Mayor; and he wants the Council to revisit same. Councilman Barad said that the existing signage protects the senior parking; and the Ordinance Committee had no discussions with Mr. Brewster on the matter. Borough Attorney noted that Mr. Watkins was objecting to the new ordinance saying that he wanted the parking lot unfettered and we did not respond to his letter inasmuch as the signs were installed to advise people of the ordinance. Chief Kaine noted that the ordinance presently calls for 20 spots; an additional 5 spots would make it easier to enforce, but presently the ordinance is working.

8. NEW BUSINESS

League Conference – Councilwoman Latner cited a municipal card for tax savings programs for property owners, which offers a percentage back on the property tax bill on purchases. There is no annual fee or risk to the municipality. Council President Amitai suggested the information be passed on to the Chamber of Commerce.

Closter Plaza – Councilwoman Chung cited the entrance to Whole Foods which opens right onto the driveway without much space between same and noted that there is no curb or demarcation on the paving or sidewalk. Borough Engineer suggested a yellow stripe be included on the punch list. Councilman Di Dio noted there are no stop signs at the end of the parking aisles.

Councilwoman Chung referred to the Town Hall meeting for a full day summer recreation program, which she said was very successful. A Survey was put up on the website; and within 24 hours, they had 190 interested kids. In addition to the present free half-day program, which is held outdoors, and, therefore, subject to cancellation because of weather, the full day program would be indoor and outdoor at a cost. The location of the indoor portion is yet to be determined. Early Bird Registration will end Feb 1st; and after that registration, the cost will increase.

Perry Street site remediation – Councilman Stabile referred to resident concerns; and Borough Engineer said that it is dependent upon the LSRP of the Perry Street site and is delineated by the CEA for ground water. He did not know the degree of contamination. Borough Administrator advised that he has a letter from the engineers doing the remediation at the old A&P property noting that it indicates there is no impact from the A&P site on 415 Demarest Avenue. Borough Engineer said he would talk to the LSRP and see if they would write the letter or possibly test the property if they prefer. Councilman Di Dio said it was his understanding that the property is not adjacent to it nor within the 200 feet. Borough Engineer said he would also e-mail the DEP and copy the Borough Administrator.

Borough Attorney referred to a resolution relative to an energy conservation program whereby PSE&G will upgrade our lighting in certain buildings and over time will cost the Borough less. He reviewed the contracts for the DPW building, Fire Department and Senior Center and the cost upfront is \$15,500.73 for the three buildings. It replaces certain bulbs with high efficiency ones; and the Borough Administrator noted the differences. Borough Attorney asked to have a resolution included in the Regular Meeting Agenda for this evening and no objections were expressed by Council members.

9. OPEN MEETING TO THE PUBLIC FOR ANY MATTER PER NJSA 10:4-12(A) SUBJECT TO A 5-MINUTE LIMIT (PER GENERAL RULE NUMBER 11) EXCEPT FOR ITEMS SCHEDULED FOR PUBLIC HEARING AT THE REGULAR MEETING

Council President Amitai opened the meeting to the public.

Michael Cohen, East Coast Director, Simon Weisenthal Center, referred to the resolution (5a. M.L. 11/10/16 received from the Norwood Borough Clerk/Administrator) regarding the delegitimization of the State of Israel by BDS (Global Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions Movement). He gave the history of the resolution and the legislation that has been passed and said we are speaking up against discrimination and anti-Semitism. The Center wishes to encourage New Jersey municipalities to pass similar resolutions. He cited instances of discrimination of Jewish people around the world by this organization, his experiences while testifying in a New York City Council meeting and encouraged the Council to include the resolution at their next meeting.

Norwood Councilman, Alan Rappaport said that the Borough of Norwood has passed the resolution; he cited instances of anti-Semitism that are occurring and urged adoption of the resolution.

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Ann Arnold, Norwood, thanked the Council for considering a resolution as she is the daughter of a Holocaust survivor and is comforted that there are people who will not stand for intolerance of any kind.

Steve Isaacson, 97 Columbus Avenue, explained he had not been attending Council meetings because he was taking a course and promised to attend all future Council meetings. He congratulated Council/Elect Victoria Amitai and Joseph Yammarino on their victory and expressed his regrets to Mr. Di Dio and referred to the following matters:

As a member of the Environmental Commission, they need a liaison from the Shade Tree Commission, which is the law; and he encouraged the governing body to appoint someone to fill that position. The Environmental Commission had a great 9th Annual MacBain Farm Fest but nobody from the Council showed up.

In response to his request for the status of the traffic study, Borough Engineer said that two weeks ago the Council decided to wait until Spring to obtain a better count. Mr. Isaacson inquired about putting a turn lane going south on Piermont Road onto Vervalen Street which the Borough Engineer said cannot be done by the municipality since same is a County Road. Mr. DeNicola confirmed that the bus company will not change their bus route unless a traffic signal is placed there. Mr. Isaacson referred to a turn lane going south from Vervalen Street on to Piermont Road and Mr. DeNicola reminded there is a right hand turn lane there now. He clarified that the issue is a left hand turn going north on Piermont Road on to Vervalen Street.

Steve Isaacson referred to the location at the (former Top Side) parking lot, which Whole Foods is using for employee parking, and informed that there are no crosswalks and no traffic signal at that intersection. He said that the least the Borough could do is put in crosswalks and signs that say "Yield to Pedestrians" because he walks that area when he gets off the bus. Borough Engineer said that currently the County is planning a project to stripe that intersection and redo the handicapped ramp including the concrete island in the northwest quadrant of the intersection.

He referred to the connected building for Bareburger and informed that they have no facilities for garbage or making deliveries. Mr. DeNicola explained that there is a walk in for garbage around and behind the movie theater and a very narrow service entrance way between the movie theater and whatever that next building is going to be.

Mr. Isaacson suggested that the Chamber of Commerce be contacted to pay for the Christmas wreaths since it benefits them and their members; and Council President Amitai and Councilman Di Dio agreed it was a very good idea.

Mr. Isaacson said he heard a rumor that the building next to Capital (50 Railroad Avenue) is now owned by eBay; Councilwoman Amitai said she was aware that it is a vendor who buys and sells digitally; he said he knows it is online; Borough Engineer said he thought it was Amazon; Mr. Isaacson said it is a big chain; the application was just before the Planning Board; it was his understanding it was supposed to be for luxury goods; Mr. Di Dio said anything is possible. Mrs. Amitai asked him to let them know anything further since he seems to know more than they do.

He referred to the three trees planted on people's properties on the southern side of Columbus Avenue that had been discussed at the last Environmental Commission meeting; and asked if they had received any notification from the Borough. Borough Engineer said he is aware that the former Borough Administrator was involved with that. Council President Amitai said she is aware that we offer street trees; Mr. Di Dio said it is a right-of-way; and Borough Engineer confirmed same saying it might be from the Shade Tree Commission.
