# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT OF CLOSTER MUNICIPAL COURT ADMINISTRATOR AS ACTING MUNICIPAL COURT ADMINISTRATOR

WHEREAS, via a Memorandum from the Superior Court of New Jersey, the Borough's Municipal Court Administrator, Judge and Mayor were notified that the Borough is now required to appoint, on a provisional basis, an Acting Municipal Court Administrator to undertake court duties when the Dumont Municipal Court Administrator is out on a scheduled and/or unscheduled leave of absence (copy attached, EXHIBIT A); and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Court Administrator has recommended that Closter enter into an agreement with the Borough of Dumont and provisionally appoint the Closter Municipal Court Administrator as Acting Municipal Court Administrator; and

WHEREAS, a Consent and Agreement is required to be prepared, executed and forwarded to the Superior Court's representative on or before January 16, 2017 (see sample, EXHIBIT A): and

WHEREAS, an Order of Provisional Authority must be prepared, signed by the Municipal Court Judge and insurance/bonding must be certified by the Administrator; the fully completed Order must be forwarded to the Superior Court's representative on or before January 16, 2017; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Closter, Bergen County, as follows:

- 1. The Borough Attorney is hereby authorized to prepare the Consent and Agreement (or review same if prepared by the Closter attorney), the Order of Provisional Authority and any other necessary documents.
- 2. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Consent and Agreement and any other documents necessary to implement this appointment.
- 3. The Municipal Court Judge is hereby authorized to execute the aforementioned Order, subject to his approval of same.
- 4. The Borough Administrator is hereby authorized to execute the aforementioned Order, subject to verification that the acting municipal court administrator has been bonded or insured by the Borough.
- 5. The Borough Administrator shall forward a fully executed copy of the Order and Agreement to Brendis Montijo-Wrigley, Municipal Division Manager, Bergen County Superior Court, 10 Main Street, Hackensack, NJ 07601 no later than January 16, 2017.
- 6. The Borough Clerk shall forward a copy of this Resolution to the Closter Municipal Court Administrator and the Dumont Borough Clerk and Municipal Court Administrator

This letter shall serve as our proposal for the preparation of construction plans, specifications, engineering estimates, and providing construction inspection services for 2023 Local Aid Program and 2023 Borough Paving Program including the milling and resurfacing, and improvements of the following roadways:

- \*West Street (Blanch Avenue to Closter Dock Road);
- \*Poplar Street (Old Hook Road to Cedar Lane);
- Farrington Avenue (entire length);
- Cedar Lanc (Harrington Avenue to Knickerbocker Road);
- Ruckman Road (Ambulance Corps to Homans Avenue);
- Locust Street ADA Curb Ramps (High Street Intersection);
- Birch Street Drainage Improvements (Lockwood Lane Intersection).
  - \* indicates 2023 Local Aid Grant roads

As the Council may be aware, West Street and Poplar Street were the streets in which Boswell Engineering, on behalf of the Borough, submitted as the 2023 NJDOT Local Aid Grant Application to NJDOT. On November 23, 2022, the DOT awarded the Borough a 2023 Local Aid Grant in the amount of \$270,810.00 toward the construction of the project improvements. Additionally, the Borough will be milling and paving Farrington Avenue, Cedar Lane from Harrington Avenue to Knickerbocker Road and Ruckman Road from the Ambulance Corps building to Homans Avenue as part of the Borough funded paving program in addition to the Birch Street Drainage Improvement and Locust Street ADA curb ramps. Additionally, a small section of Ruckman Road just east of Ruckman Pond will be repaved due to deterioration


resulting from a broken water service. The total estimated construction cost for the Borough Road Program is approximately \$340,000.00. Boswell Engineering recommends combining the 2023 Local Aid project with the 2023 Borough Road Program (total construction amount of \$640,000) for bidding purposes to achieve the benefit of the economies of scale (higher quantities, lower unit bid prices), which the Borough has successfully implemented on previous paving projects.

#### Scope of Work

The scope of work for Boswell Engineering's design and construction inspection services for the 2023 Local Aid Grant and 2023 Borough Paving Program consists of the milling and resurfacing of the roadways enumerated above including the upgrading of the stormwater inlets to meet current NJDOT and NJDEP requirements, replacement of sanitary sewer manholes, as required, and the installation of ADA compliant curb ramps at all roadway intersections where sidewalk currently exists. A new storm water inlet and related piping will be added along Birch Street to address an on-going drainage issue and the ADA curb ramps will be reconstructed at the intersection of Locust Street and High Street to inhibit storm water on High Street from entering private property. Additionally, with input from the Closter DPW, Boswell Engineering recommends providing for the crack sealing of various roadways within the Borough, which extends the pavement life of the roads by preventing stormwater runoff from entering the subsurface of the roads through the cracks thus accelerating a deteriorating roadway condition.

#### Scope of Services

- Conduct a site inspection and limited survey of the roads to prepare project Key Maps and contract quantities for the Borough's paving program for inclusion into the contract documents. As required by the NJDOT, a full set of Contract Pans will be prepared for the improvements to West Street and Poplar Street (2023 Local Aid Grant Roads).
- 2. Prepare the requisite construction plans, specifications, and Engineer's Estimates in accordance with NJDOT and the Borough of Closter requirements.
- 3. Submit the project plans, specifications, estimates, and engineer's certification to the NJDOT for review and comment.
- 4. Address NJDOT comments, prepare final Contract bid documents, and advertise the project for bids.
- 5. Review contractor bids and make a recommendation of award to the Borough of Closter.
- Coordinate and attend a preconstruction meeting with appropriate Borough officials,
   NJDOT, utility companies, and other parties affected by the construction activities.
- 7. Provide part-time inspection services during the construction phase.
- 8. Review contractor invoices to the Borough of Closter.
- 9. Make a final inspection of the project improvements.

- Prepare a final change order and payments voucher to the Borough of Closter.
- Coordinate the required documents and submissions in the NJDOT's PRMS system inclusive of the final reimbursement documentation required by NJDOT.

#### Fee Proposal

Boswell will perform the services outlined in the proposal for an estimated fee not to exceed \$36,000.00 for the design and survey phase and \$49,000.00 for the construction inspection phase. The fee breakdown is only an estimate and will be adjusted to reflect the actual effort for each phase. The total fee, however, will not exceed \$85,000.00.

#### Items Not Included in the Engineering Fee

The following items are not anticipated to be required and are therefore excluded:

- 1. Permit Pees
- 2. NJDEP & BCSCD Permits
- Right-of-Way and/or Easement Plans or Descriptions
- Structural Calculations and Plans (for Retaining Walls)

Additional work above and beyond what is outlined in the proposal will only be performed as authorized by the Borough of Closter.

VHS is a comprehensive behavioral health care organization whose treatment and housing services benefit more than 3,000 individuals and families annually with mental health, addiction, developmental and eldercare challenges.

Vantage Health System owns and operates 3 outpatient locations and 17 residential sites for individuals with mental illness in Bergen County. Vantage maintains contracts with the State of New Jersey, the NJ Department of Health and Senior Services. the NJ Department of Human Services, the NJ Department of Children and Families, the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, the County of Bergen and other public and private entities.
