# September 11<sup>th</sup> Memorial Service

The community is invited to gather in remembrance on *Monday, September 11<sup>th</sup>* for the 9/11 Memorial Service. The Closter's service is held at the 9/11 Memorial located on the corner of Cedar Lane and Harrington Avenue and begins promptly at 8:30 a.m.

Closter's September 11th Memorial was completed in 2004. The annual September 11th Service continues to honor and remember all of the Americans whose lives were so profoundly affected as well as pay homage to all those whose sacrifices have provided our cherished freedom. Signifying the moment that all of our lives were changed, this Memorial stands as a moment in time when at precisely 8:46 a.m. a beam of sunlight illuminates a piece of steel that was recovered from the World Trade Center.

On behalf of all of the volunteers that made this Memorial possible, we welcome you and your families and encourage your participation in this service.

## **Closter Police Department**

Schools' Open!! Drive Carefully!! **Tuesday, September 5**<sup>th</sup> **is the first day of school**. Please help us keep our children safe... *Slow Down* – speed limits in school zones are reduced for a reason! *Watch for bicycles* – keep distance between your vehicle and a bicyclist; require your child wear a helmet! *Eliminate Distractions* – reduce risk by not using your cell phone, texting or eating while driving and allow extra time to transport to and from schools.

NJ State law states motorists must STOP for pedestrians in marked crosswalks. The failure to observe the law could subject the driver to one or more of the following – two points, costly fines (plus court costs), insurance surcharges or 15 days community service. Please help us to keep Closter's residents and visitors safe!

The Closter Police Department has announced a **Safe Exchange Zone** for conducting in-person internet transactions. Residents wary of transactions via the internet with an unknown buyer or seller will now be able to do so in the parking lot of the Closter Police headquarters located at 295 Closter Dock Rd. There is a Safe Exchange Zone sign in the parking lot denoting the area under surveillance. The Closter Police will not have a hand in any transactions, act as witnesses or be involved in authentication of any item.

New maps, new signs and refurbished trails provide an additional opportunity for enjoying the beautiful green spaces throughout the borough. The Closter Environmental Commission has been working on developing this passive recreational opportunity under the leadership of Sophie Heymann and Steve Isaacson.
