Closter's Memorial Day Parade and Service:

The Leroy S. Mead Post 111 American Legion, the Closter Elks Lodge 2304 and the Borough of Closter are hosting the 2018 Memorial Day Parade and Memorial Service on Monday, May 28, 2018. In honor of and with respect for the 18 Closter residents who gave the ultimate sacrifice in World War I, World War II and Vietnam, as well as those residents who are currently serving our Country, the Events are as follows:

2018 Memorial Day Schedule of Events

8:30 a.m. American Legion, Leroy S. Mead Post 111 Memorial Service Veterans Monument Park, Herbert Avenue & Closter Dock Road

9:00 a.m. Closter Fire Department Service 100 Ruckman Road

10:00 a.m. Memorial Day Parade

Participants *assemble at 9:30 a.m.* in the St. Mary's Church parking area; The parade steps off at 10:00 a.m.

Route: The parade begins on Legion Place at High Street, (St. Mary's parking lot) continues east on High St. to Closter Dock Rd., bearing left; then proceeds north on Closter Dock Rd., then west onto Harrington Avenue, concluding at Veteran's Memorial Park

The Memorial Day Service is held on the north side of Veteran's Memorial Park and begins immediately following the conclusion of the parade. Please join in the community's spirit and commitment in honoring the service men and women of our Armed Forces by lining the streets along the parade route and displaying American flags. All residents are invited to the Closter Elks for refreshments following the Memorial Day Service. *This event is rain or shine*. In the event of an extreme weather condition, i.e. lightning, the Memorial Day Service will be moved indoors to the Closter Elks Lodge on Railroad Avenue. Festivities are planned for Friday, June 1st between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. at Veterans' Memorial Park. Closter Plaza

What happens when *Edens* (Closter Plaza) + *Arts Unbound*, *Inc.* get together? *The answer....*a one of a kind Art Show & Sale in Closter Plaza! *Arts Unbound*, a nonprofit visual arts organization that promotes the work of artists with disabilities and emerging senior artists, has worked with artists in Bergen County for years, but has never had a physical location in the area. This is about to end, if only temporarily.

Arts Unbound is opening a pop-up shop in Closter Plaza (between Cardture and Marcia's Attic) the weekend of June 1-3. The shop will officially open on Friday, June 1 at 1 pm. The public is invited to join artists, volunteer and staff for an opening celebration from 5-7 pm. The shop will remain open Saturday, June 2 from 10am-6pm and Sunday, June 3 from 10am-4pm. Volunteers from the Belskie Museum of Art & Science are assisting with the installation of the art and staffing the shop during the weekend. Closter is Named Tree City USA

Closter has been named a Tree City USA city by the Arbor Day Foundation for the 17th consecutive year in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management. Closter achieved Tree City USA recognition by meeting the program's four requirements. Trees provide multiple benefits to a community when properly planted and maintained. They help to improve the visual appeal of a neighborhood, increase property values, reduce home cooling costs, remove air pollutants and provide wildlife habitat, among many other benefits.

A note from the Shade Tree Commission... "Summer is almost here and Closter's tree canopy is full and lush. A tree is a natural air conditioner. The evaporation from a single tree can produce the cooling effect of 10 room-size, residential air conditioners operating 20 hours a day. An abundant canopy ensures that summer temperatures are at least 6 to 8 degrees lower than in neighborhoods without trees. More good news is that trees and other vegetation slow heartbeats, lower blood pressure, relax brainwave patterns and enhance a community's respiratory health. Let's help keep our community healthy and nurture our trees!"

The MacBain Farm

Closter's MacBain Farm, situated on five and a half acres of Borough parkland on Hickory Lane, is operated as a working farm under the oversight of the Closter Environmental Commission. The MacBain Farm is open Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for all visitors, but *only Closter residents* have the privilege of picking a bucket full of the myriad vegetables and herbs growing profusely and organically on the farm. Visitors must bring a form of identification. One bucket per day per family is the limit.

To keep the farm in full production the Borough needs farm volunteers to aid in the controlling of weeds, staking tomatoes, planting and seeding second round crops and to monitor the fields against illegal harvesting. Families are welcome, but children under age sixteen need to be accompanied by an adult.
