Monday, March 4<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm is the date of the **Town Hall Meeting** designed to provide an overview of property tax assessments. This presentation, which is being given by Closter Tax Assessor, Angela Mattiace, and representatives of Appraisal Systems, the Borough's assessment contractor, will deliver an overview of the appraisal process used to establish Closter's property/real estate values.

This meeting is a *general information only* meeting. Questions and concerns pertaining to individual properties *will not be addressed* at this time.

The Town Hall Meeting will be held in the Closter Senior Building, 4 Lewis St. which is located directly behind the Closter Borough Hall.

Saturday, March 16<sup>th</sup> at 9-4pm: Spring Book Sale from 9am-4pm


